## Vaccination Centre – Access Information

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<p>Where is this vaccination centre?</p>	<p>Edington Vaccination Centre is located within Edington Cottage Hospital.</p> <p>The address is:</p> <p>Edington Cottage Hospital 54 St Baldreds Road North Berwick EH39 4PU</p>
<p>How do I find this vaccination centre?</p>	<p>The vaccination clinic is in room 7, which is to the right-hand side as you enter the building.</p> <p>As you enter the front entrance, you will see reception directly in front of you.</p>
<p>How can I get to this vaccination centre?</p>	<p>The clinic can be accessed by walking or wheeling via St Baldreds Road.</p> <p>The clinic can be accessed by cycling.</p> <p>Buses that serve this location include:</p> <p>Eve Coaches 121 from Haddington stops at Lochbridge Road.</p>

	<p>From Dunbar, the 120 will stop on the High Street. This bus stop is about 10 minutes from the clinic and is connected by an uphill path.</p> <p>If travelling by car, follow signs for St Baldreds Road.</p>
Is there a quiet room or private space?	<p>Yes, there is a private space that can be used for vaccination. Please speak to the receptionist when you arrive.</p> <p>Prior arrangement would be beneficial in advance of your visit, but we will accommodate you however we can.</p>
Is this vaccination site wheelchair accessible?	Yes, the vaccination clinic is wheelchair accessible.
What toilet facilities are available?	Two accessible toilets are located by the main entrance.
Are there hearing loops in use?	There are no hearing loops at this Vaccination Centre.
Are assistance dogs welcome?	<p>Assistance dogs are welcome at every Vaccination Centre.</p> <p>If you need any additional support, please speak to a member of staff who will be happy to help.</p>
What are the parking arrangements?	<p>There is no secure bike storage available on site.</p> <p>Limited car parking is available on site or there is free parking on St Baldreds Road, although this can be limited too.</p> <p>There is also parking available on surrounding side streets, but we ask visitors to be considerate to residents.</p>
Can I attend my appointment with a friend, family member or carer?	<p>Yes, we are happy to accommodate your visit with anyone who makes you more comfortable, although we would advise limiting this to one other person where possible.</p> <p>Parents and carers are welcome to bring children along with them.</p>
Are there interpretation services?	Yes, all clinics can provide telephone interpretation services. Please let the vaccinator or a member of the team know which language you require.

	<p>For verbal interpretation, a call will be made to The Big Word service where you and your vaccinator will be connected to an interpreter.</p> <p>You do not need to arrange this in advance of your visit.</p>
<p>Can I arrange a BSL interpreter for an appointment?</p>	<p>Yes, please call the Vaccination Enquiries Helpline before your visit on 0300 790 6296 or email <a href="mailto:loth.vaccenquiries@nhslothian.scot.nhs.uk">loth.vaccenquiries@nhslothian.scot.nhs.uk</a> to request the assistance of a BSL interpreter. A member of the Translation and Interpretation Team will help to arrange this for you. This needs to be pre-arranged before your appointment.</p>
