Where is this vaccination centre?	 Blackburn Vaccination Centre is located inside the Blackburn Partnership Centre. The clinic is located in the multi purpose room on a Friday and Health Education Room on a Saturday The address is: Ash Grove Blackburn Bathgate EH47 7LL
How do I find this vaccination centre?	Enter the main entrance for the multipurpose room head straight ahead and the clinic is located on the right hand side half way along the length of the building. For the health education room, the reception desk for the vaccination clinic is located at the entrance to the building.
How can I get to this vaccination centre?	The clinic is accessible by walking or wheeling via Main Street. The clinic is accessible by cycling. The centre is serviced by the numbers 18 and 26.



	If driving, from East Main Street turn onto Bathgate Road and then right onto Ashgrove, the Partnership Centre is just past the carpark to the Mill Shopping Centre.
Is there a quiet room or private space?	There is no access to a private room that can be used for vaccination. The Vaccination team will endeavour to provide a quiet space if this is required.
	Please inform the receptionists when you arrive there is no required to make this arrangement beforehand.
Is this vaccination site wheelchair accessible?	Yes the main entrance is wheelchair accessible.
What toilet facilities are available?	There is access to toilets and accessible toilets.
Are there hearing loops in use?	There are no changing facilities onsite.
Are there hearing loops in use?	No
Are assistance dogs welcome?	Assistance dogs are welcome at every Vaccination Centre. If you need any additional support, please speak to a member of staff who will be happy to help.
What are the parking arrangements?	There is a carpark with disability spaces marked in front of the building.
	There are racks available for secure storage of bikes.
Can I attend my appointment at this site with a friend, family member or carer?	Yes. You are welcome to bring a friend, family member or carer with you but we do ask this is limited to one person, where possible.
	Parents and carers are welcome to bring children along with them.
Are there interpretation services?	Yes, all clinics can provide telephone interpretation services. Please let the vaccinator or a member of the team know which language you require.
	For verbal interpretation, a call will be made to The Big Word service where you and your vaccinator will be connected to an interpreter.
	You do not need to arrange this in advance of your visit.
